The reason why a sinner does not fear God even after sinning a hundred times and is bold in his heart to sin again is because God does not punish the sinner immediately (Ecclesiastes 8:11-12).

God's purpose in doing this is to make the sinner repent due to God's abundant mercy, generosity, and patience (Romans 2:4).

However, a righteous person who serves God with a fearful heart will certainly prosper (Ref.: Ecclesiastes 8:12-13).

Even though we have heavy burdens placed on us by God while we toil in this world ...

Even though we have heavy burdens placed on us by God while we toil in this world (Ecclesiastes 3:10), we should humbly and faithfully respond to Jesus' invitation when He says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28), and find rest in Him.

This too was in vain.

I thought I would have fun and be happy in this world, but this too was in vain (Ecclesiastes 2:1).

It is all meaningless, like chasing after the wind.

No matter how much greater we become than others, no matter if we possess everything we desire and deny ourselves nothing that our hearts delight in to enjoy life, it is all meaningless, like chasing after the wind (Ref.: Ecclesiastes 2:3, 7-11).

This is the destiny of man.

The best thing to do during the short life given by God is to eat, drink, and feel satisfied with one's work, and this is the destiny of man (Ecclesiastes 5:18).

He reveals his foolishness.

A foolish person has no wisdom, so he reveals his foolishness to everyone as he walks down the street. He starts off talking foolishly and then talks like a madman. A fool is a man of many words (Ecclesiastes 10:3, 13-14).

A little foolishness

A little foolishness overshadows wisdom and honor (Ecclesiastes 10:1).

To live alone without any children or siblings to inherit your wealth ...

To live alone without any children or siblings to inherit your wealth, tirelessly working without enjoying life, not knowing for whom you work so hard, and yet not finding satisfaction in your riches—all of this is meaningless and unfortunate (Ecclesiastes 4:8).

We should not curse.

Do not curse leaders even in your heart, and do not curse rich people even in your bedroom. The birds of the air will carry the sound, and the birds will spread the news (Ecclesiastes 10:20).

Since Almighty God has decided, who can thwart His plan?

Since Almighty God has decided, who can thwart His plan?

There is no one!

If God opens His hand to punish, who can stop it?

There is no one!

(Ref.: Isaiah 14:27)

What Almighty God has planned ...

What Almighty God has planned will surely come true, and what God has decided to do will surely be carried out (Isaiah 14:24).

Since youth is fleeting ...

Since youth is fleeting, young people should rejoice in the fact that they are still young and enjoy their youth to the fullest by doing whatever they want to do.

But we must remember that there is also God's judgment

(Ref.: Ecclesiastes 11:9-10).

We must serve the Lord's church with justice and sincerity.

Our church leaders must support the poor and powerless. And we must serve the Lord's church with justice and sincerity (Ref.: Isaiah 11:4, 5).

May the Lord put us in a furnace ...

May the Lord put us in a furnace to remove impurities and purify us (Ref.: Isaiah 1:25).

The Lord will give us peace.

The Lord will accomplish all things for us and give us peace (Isaiah 26:12).

May the Lord will expand the scope of our service and mission ...

We pray that the Lord will expand the scope of our service and mission and gain glory by expanding the kingdom of God (Ref.: Isaiah 26:15).

I pray that the Lord will build His Church ...

I pray that the Lord will build His Church so that His suffering people can find refuge there (Ref.: Isaiah 14:32).

I pray that the Lord will show the wicked ...

I pray that the Lord will show the wicked how much He loves His children and put them to shame (Ref.: Isaiah 26:11).

After planting the best vines, the Lord waits for them to produce good grapes ...

After planting the best vines, the Lord waits for them to produce good grapes.

The Lord wants and expects us to be fair, to do what is right, and what is good.

But isn't it only the cries of those who are suffering now?

The Lord is saying to us, "What more can I do for my vineyard?"

(Ref.: Isaiah 5:2, 4, 7).

Aren't we harassing the Lord?

Isn't our church now harassing the Lord,

who is the head of the church?

(Ref.: Isaiah 1:24)

Let us cherish the words of the Lord.

The disciples of Jesus cherish the words given to us by the Lord Jesus Christ

(Ref.: Isaiah 8:16).

We must always remember and cherish in our hearts

the twofold commandment of the Lord Jesus Christ:

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart

and with all your soul and with all your mind"

and "Love your neighbor as yourself"

(Ref.: Deuteronomy 11:18; Matthew 22:37, 39).

We must allow whoever the Lord loves to come into His church.

We must open the doors of our hearts and the doors of the Lord's church and allow whoever the Lord loves to come in (Ref.: Isaiah 26:2).

Because the Lord Himself protects His church ...

Our church is strong because the Lord Himself protects His church (Ref.: Isaiah 26:1).

What is worse than death ...

What is worse than death is a woman whose heart is like a trap or a net and whose hands are like chains.

A man who pleases God avoids such a woman, but a sinner falls into her trap (Ecclesiastes 7:26).

A wise person thinks a lot about death.

He knows that the day of death is better than the day of birth, and going to a funeral is better than going to a wedding.

He also knows that sorrow is better than laughter because one can learn something new from sorrow.

A wise person understands that it is good to keep in mind

A wise person thinks a lot about death.

(Ref.: Ecclesiastes 7:1-5).

the fact that everyone will eventually die.

Listening to the rebuke of such a wise person
is better than hearing the praise of a foolish person
who only thinks about the immediate pleasures before them

Aren't the current church leaders and members like the people of Sodom and Gomorrah?

Aren't the current church leaders and members like the people of Sodom and Gomorrah? Then we must listen to what the Lord says and listen to His teachings (Ref.: Isaiah 1:10).

With its words and actions ...

Isn't our church now opposing the Lord with its words and actions and insulting the God of glory?

(Ref.: Isaiah 3:8)

Could the Lord be saying this to our church right now?

Could the Lord be saying this to our church right now?

'What use are your numerous offerings to me?

I am tired of your offerings.

I do not take pleasure in your offerings.

Who asked you to bring them?

You are merely trampling my courts.

Stop bringing meaningless offerings.

I have grown weary of your ceremonies.

I cannot bear your evil actions while you celebrate

church festivals and hold religious gatherings.

I hate your church festivals

because they have become a burden to me;

I am weary of bearing them.

Even if you lift up your hands in prayer,

I will not look; even if you offer many prayers, I will not listen.

The reason is that you continue to sin against me.

Repent and rid yourselves of your evil behavior before me;

cease your sinful ways'

(Ref.: Isaiah 1:11-16).

Is it possible that our church leaders are ...

Is it possible that our church leaders are currently misguiding their members and leading them down a path of destruction?

(Ref.: Isaiah 3:12)

A leader must stand upright with love ...

A leader must stand upright with love, lead followers faithfully, quickly carry out the right thing, and implement justice (Ref.: Isaiah 16:5).

The denizens of Hell are making a fuss as they prepare to face their evil rulers.

The denizens of Hell are making a fuss as they prepare to face their evil rulers. When the inhabitants see the evil rulers, they will say with one voice, "You, too, have become as weak as we are!" (Reference: Isaiah 14:9-10

Wisdom is better than strength and better than weapons.

Wisdom is better than strength and better than weapons. The quiet words of a wise man are better than the shouts of a foolish president (Ecclesiastes 9:16, 17, 18).

Wisdom changes the expression on a person's face.

Wisdom brightens a person's face and changes a fierce (hard) facial expression (Ecclesiastes 8:1).

A wise Christian sharpens his own mind by the Word of God, the sword of his Spirit.

If the blade is dull

because we haven't sharpened the axe, it takes more force.

Therefore, sharpening an ax blade is a wise method.

(Ecclesiastes 10:10).

A wise Christian sharpens his own mind

by the Word of God, the sword of his Spirit.

(Ephesians 6:17).

However, foolish Christians neglect this task

and their spiritual sensitivity becomes dull.

He cannot distinguish between good and evil,

so he tends to lean to the left or right

(Ref.: Hebrews 5:14).

A wise man vs. A foolish man

A wise man's heart is inclined to do what is right, and his words are gracious, but a foolish man's heart is inclined to do evil, and his words are his ruin (Ecclesiastes 10:2, 12).

A wise person knows that sadness is better than laughter.

Everything in this world has a set time and deadline.

There is a time for us to cry and a time to be sad, and a time for us to laugh and a time to dance (Ecclesiastes 3:1, 4).

A wise person knows that sadness is better than laughter.

And he realizes something new through that sadness (7:3).

Proverb of a wise person

A wise person continually teaches others what he knows and, while deeply thinking and researching, he gathers and organizes many truthful proverbs without much falsehood. These proverbs are like goads used to drive cattle, and like firmly embedded nails. All of them are given by God, our Shepherd (Ref.: Ecclesiastes 12:9-11).

What a wise man must be very wary of ...

What a wise man must be very wary of is greed, which makes him foolish, and bribery, which corrupts his heart (Ref.: Ecclesiastes 7:7).

May the Lord raise wise leaders ...

I pray that the Lord will raise up wise leaders in His church (Ref.: Isaiah 1:26).

Wisdom and money

Wisdom is more beneficial than money because it preserves the life of the person who possesses it (Ecclesiastes 7:12).

Weighed down

The world is weighed down by sin (Ref.: Isaiah 24:20).

It is truly terrifying ...

It is truly terrifying that God's anger does not cease and His hand remains stretched out (Ref.: Isaiah 10:4).

It is truly a grievous vanity ...

It is truly a grievous vanity that, although God gives wealth, honor, and everything we desire so that nothing is lacking, He does not allow us to enjoy them, and instead, someone else enjoys them

(Ref.: Ecclesiastes 6:2).

We must remember our Creator God.

We must remember our Creator God. Especially, we must remember our Creator God while we are still young, before the days of trouble come and the years approach when we will say, 'I find no pleasure in them.' Before we become too old, when our strong legs become weak, our teeth fall out and we can no longer chew food well, our eyes grow dim and we cannot see, our ears grow dull and we cannot hear, we can no longer sleep deeply, our voice trembles, our hair turns completely white, we have difficulty moving and can barely carry ourselves, all our desires and passions disappear, and the day when mourners come to our house is not far off. If we try to remember our Creator God at that time, it will be too late. Before the dust returns to the ground it came from and the spirit returns to God who gave it, we must remember our Creator God (Ref.: Ecclesiastes 12:1-7).

(Ref.: Isaiah 12:6)

The evil rulers who shook the world and made the nations tremble ...

The evil rulers who shook the world and made the nations tremble will not be buried like other rulers. Their bodies will be thrown away without a grave, like worthless branches, covered by the corpses of soldiers killed in battle, and they will be trampled underfoot on the streets. The descendants of those who commit evil like them will disappear from memory forever (Ref.: Isaiah 14:16-20).

We must do our best.

We must do our best in whatever we do.

That's because there won't be anything like that in the tomb we're about to enter.

(Ref.: Ecclesiastes 9:10).

It will turn into sighing, lamentation, and sorrow.

The boasting and arrogance of proud and haughty people will turn into sighing, lamentation, and sorrow because of the suffering they will endure

(Ref.: Isaiah 16:7).

The wise person who has become foolish due to greed ...

The wise person who has become foolish due to greed focuses more on beginnings than on endings, lacks patience, behaves arrogantly, and acts rashly like fools who quickly become angry. Furthermore, he laments, 'Why is the present worse than the past?' and longs for his former glory days (Ref.: Ecclesiastes 7:7-10).

Abundance overflows

The abundance of understanding the truth of the gospel of Jesus Christ gives us overflowing gratitude (1 Corinthians 1:5; Colossians 2:7).

No matter how much we boast as creatures ...

No matter how much we boast as creatures, our Creator God says this: 'Can the axe boast over the one who wields it?

Or the saw magnify itself against the one who saws with it?

As if a rod could wield the person who lifts it up,
or a club could lift up someone who is not wood'

(Ref.: Isaiah 10:13-15).

God will punish such a person.

Woe to those who create evil laws, pass unjust judgments, deprive the poor of their rights, denying them fair justice, and robbing widows and orphans.

God will punish such a person
(Isaiah 10:1-3).

God has done an amazing thing ...

God has done an amazing thing, and we must praise Him and let the whole world hear about it (Ref.: Isaiah 12:5).

All those whom God will destroy in his anger ...

All those whom God will destroy in his anger will be so frightened that their faces will turn pale, their hands will be weak and their courage will be lost (Ref.: Isaiah 13:1-8).

I pray that God will break the power of evil rulers.

I pray that God will break the power of evil rulers.

As a result, I hope that the citizens of that country will regain peace and sing with joy (Ref.: Isaiah 14:5-7).

God will break our pride ...

Almighty God will break our pride and humble the nobles of the world (Ref.: Isaiah 23:9).

God will punish the enemies of the church ...

God will punish the enemies of the church and cause them to fear the church (Ref.: Isaiah 19:17).

God frustrates the plans of the wicked.

Through the prophet Isaiah,

God spoke to King Ahaz of Judah, who was trembling with fear:

The kings of Syria and Israel are plotting to harm King Ahaz.

They intend to invade Judah, frighten its people, and lure them onto their side.

Their plan includes installing the son of Tabeel as king.

But God assured, 'But it will not take place, it will not happen'

(Isaiah 7:5-7).

God frustrates the plans of the wicked

(Psalms 146:9).

God uses things that we rely on more than Him ...

The Almighty God, the Holy God who is the light of Israel, spoke like a fire.

He said that within just one day, He would send a plague upon the arrogant Assyrian army,

likened to thorns and thistles, to punish them.

They and all their glory would be consumed by fire.

No matter how mighty and numerous the Assyrian army may be,

they will all be destroyed like sick people dying off.

Even if there are survivors, their number will be so small that it could be counted, as God said.

Then, only the remnant of Israel that survives will no longer rely on the Assyrian army

but will truly trust in the Holy God of Israel, Yahweh.

When I meditate on these words,

I think that God uses things that we rely on more than Him,

and disciplines us with love for our arrogance,

so that in the end, we no longer rely on that or that person,

but rely only on God (Ref.: Isaiah 10:16-20).

Only God will be exalted.

The day is coming when the proud will be humbled, the arrogant will be broken, and only God will be exalted. On that day, all the proud and arrogant will be humbled, all idols will disappear, and only God will be exalted (Isaiah 2:11, 17).

We must focus all our attention on God.

We must focus all our attention on God, who planned all of this in our lives long ago and made it happen (Ref.: Isaiah 22:11).

God made man honest ...

God made man honest, but man came up with various schemes (Ecclesiastes 7:29).

God is our strength, our song, and our salvation.

God is our strength, our song, and our salvation. So let us draw with joy from the well of salvation (Ref.: Isaiah 12:2-3).

Because God is righteous ...

Because God is righteous, He will save all who repent and return to the Lord (Ref.: Isaiah 1:27).

We must trust in the Almighty Lord God, who executes His plans as already determined.

The Almighty Lord God, who declares rightful destruction upon the people of Israel and surely executes it as already planned, says to His people who dwell in Zion: 'Even if the Assyrians strike you with a rod and raise their staff against you, do not fear them. For soon My anger against you will end, and My wrath will be directed against them. ... On that day I will break the yoke off their necks and tear off their bonds; the yoke they have imposed on you will be broken, and the bonds will be lifted' (Isaiah 10:21-27).

When contemplating these words,

I receive the lesson that we must trust in the Almighty Lord God, who executes His plans as already determined, and believe that God will break the yoke that has been imposed on us, so that it will no longer be a burden to us.

God gives those who please him ...

God gives wisdom, knowledge, and happiness to those who please Him, but He gives sinners the trouble of gathering and accumulating wealth and handing it over to those who please Him (Ecclesiastes 2:26).

The church of God vs. The church of men (1)

In the church of God there is grace and peace, but in the church of men there is merit, strife, strife, and division.

The church of God vs. The church of men (2)

God's church is full of gratitude, but man's church is full of complaints.

The church of God vs. The church of men (3)

There is humility in God's church, but there is pride in man's church.

The church of God vs. The church of men (4)

In God's church, people rely only on the merits of the cross of Jesus Christ, but in people's churches, they record in their hearts the merits they have done for the Lord and the church, and are recognized by church members and praised by others.

The church of God vs. The church of men (5)

In God's church, the truth of the gospel of Jesus Christ is proclaimed, but in man's church, man's 'gospel' (good news) that scratches people's itching ears is making a sound like a cymbal.

The church of God vs. The church of men (6)

In God's church, the saints stand firm in the testimony of Christ by hearing and understanding the truth of the gospel, but in the church of men, there is no such solidity.

The church of God vs. The church of men (7)

In God's church, each saint graciously uses the spiritual gifts given by God with wisdom and self-control to build His church.

In human-made churches, saints often selfishly and unrestrainedly use the gifts and talents given by God to boast about themselves.

The church of God vs. The church of men (8)

In God's church, the Lord, who is the head of the church, is glorified, but in man's church, people are glorified.

The kingdom of God is a kingdom of love.

The commandments of the kingdom of God are:

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul,

with all your mind, and with all your strength"

and "Love your neighbor as yourself"

(Mark 12:30-31).

Those who believe in Jesus Christ by God's grace

and possess "eternal life" (Romans 6:23) as a gift of grace (1 John 3:14)

must devote their heart, life, will, and strength

according to Jesus' twofold commandment.

We obey the commandment to love the Lord God

with all our hearts and to love our neighbors as ourselves.

Therefore, he purifies his soul to love his brother unfeignedly

(1 Peter 1:22).

This is how we practice righteousness, just as Jesus practiced righteousness

(1 John 2:6).

Therefore, the life of "seeking first the kingdom of God and his righteousness"

(Matthew 6:33) means that we, as citizens of God's kingdom of love,

love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength as Jesus did.

Just as Jesus loved his neighbors as himself,

we also follow Jesus' example and live in obedience to Jesus' twofold commandment.

The kingdom of God will always be peaceful.

The kingdom of God, ruled and governed by the Almighty God

who is the King of Peace, will always be peaceful.

The zeal of the Almighty God will accomplish this!

(Ref.: Isaiah 9:6-7).

God was using even arrogant people like me, who do not know God's will and have different thoughts and plans ...

God used Assyria as a rod of God's anger and used its military power to punish the Israelites who sinned and did not repent. However, the Assyrian emperor did not know God's will and had a different idea and planned to conquer the world. In this way, God used the arrogant Assyrian emperor, who boasted and showed off his power, strength, and wisdom, and punished him after he had fulfilled God's will (Ref.: Isaiah 10:5-13). As I meditated on these words, I thought that God was using even arrogant people like me, who do not know God's will and have different thoughts and plans, to accomplish His will. Nevertheless, rather than punishing me after accomplishing God's will through my arrogant self, it seems that God disciplines me with love and makes me humble, allowing me to understand God's will and obey it.

I pray that the Holy Spirit of God will grant our church leaders ...

I pray that the Holy Spirit of God will grant our church leaders wisdom, knowledge, and abilities to serve the flocks entrusted by the Lord and His church. May they understand God's will, serve Him with reverent hearts, and find joy in obedience to the Lord (Ref.: Isaiah 11:2-3).

When we go up to the temple of God to worship Him ...

When we go up to the temple of God to worship Him, we must be careful not to open our mouths and make rash promises to God without realizing our own sins. We must not sin with our mouths.

God is not pleased with these foolish people
(Ref.: Ecclesiastes 5:1-2, 6).

We must live the truth.

We must go up to the temple of God. God will teach us the truth and we must live that truth (Ref.: Isaiah 2:3).

The fate given to humans by God ...

The fate given to humans by God is painful and distressing (Ecclesiastes 1:13).

Everything God does will remain forever.

What we do is temporary and will not be remembered later (Ref.: Ecclesiastes 1:11, 2:16), but everything God does will remain forever (Ref.: 3:14).

When those in power oppress, the oppressed weep, but there is no one to comfort them.

When those in power oppress, the oppressed weep, but there is no one to comfort them.

So, King Solomon declared that those who have already died are happier than the living. However, happier still are those who have not yet been born and have not seen the evil in this world (Ecclesiastes 4:1-3).

One sinner ...

One sinner harms much good (Ecclesiastes 9:18).

He who sets a trap ...

He who sets a trap will fall into it himself (Ecclesiastes 10:8).

We must always live life joyfully in the Lord.

No matter how long a person lives, there will be a day of death someday, and we must always live life joyfully in the Lord (Ref.: Ecclesiastes 11:8).

God will liberate and give them rest.

God will liberate his children from sorrow, pain, and hardship and give them rest (Ref.: Isaiah 14:3).

When the current adversity is overwhelming ...

When the current adversity is overwhelming,
do not long for the times when there was no hardship
(Ref.: Ecclesiastes 7:10).
Instead, remember and celebrate with faith God's saving love and grace that delivered us from (greater) adversities in the past.

Could it be that we are rejecting the warm protection of our Heavenly Father ...?

Could it be that we are rejecting the warm protection of our Heavenly Father and are eager for others to help us? (Reference: Isaiah 8:6)

Isn't it possible that all of our church leaders ...

Isn't it possible that all of our church leaders like to receive bribes and gifts?

(Ref.: Isaiah 1:23)

Is it possible that the sins of us Christians are ...

Is it possible that the sins of us Christians are like a fire that burns thorns and thistles, with the smoke of those sins rising like a raging wildfire? (Ref.: Isaiah 9:18)

Woe to those ... (1)

Woe to those who drag sin with cords of lies and evil like a chariot (Isaiah 5:18).

Woe to those ... (2)

Woe to those who think they are wise and clever (Isaiah 5:21).

If we give generously to as many people as possible ...

If we give generously to as many people as possible, it will eventually come back to us
